

SPEAKER HIGHLIGHTS

HONORABLE J. CLIFFORD WALLACE

Judge J. Clifford Wallace received his judicial commission as a U.S. district judge in San Diego on October 16, 1970, and two years later, was elevated to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. Judge Wallace has devoted more than 50 years to the law, serving 24 of those years as an active judge on the nation's largest federal appellate court, the last five in an executive role as chief circuit judge. A retired senior judge, Judge Wallace has also served with distinction in various administrative roles at the highest levels of the federal judiciary. He received appointments from two chief justices of the Supreme Court to serve on important committees of the Judicial Conference of the United States. His ideas and subsequent work with the late Chief Justice Warren E. Burger led to the establishment of the American Inns of Court, a national organization that now claims 75,000 members dedicated to excellence, civility, professionalism, and ethics in the practice of law. Judge Wallace has contributed to and enhanced the educational and training opportunities for judges and court staff in the island nations of the South Pacific and helped obtain significant federal funding for that effort from Congress.



Recent honors and awards include: Bernie Siegan Award for Outstanding Achievement in Constitutional Scholarship, 2010; The International Center for Law and Religion Studies at BYU Award for Distinguished Service in Promoting Religious Freedom, 2009; Judge D. Lowell and Barbara Jensen Public Service Award, 2008; Edward J. Devitt Distinguished Service to Justice Award, 2005.

Judge Wallace has addressed various entities, including; the American Bar Association; American College of Trial Lawyers; American Enterprise Institute for Public Policy Research; American Inns of Court; American Judicature Society; Appellate Judges' Seminar; Appellate Judges Conference of the American Bar Association; The Brookings Institution Conference on the Judiciary at Williamsburg; Department of Justice; various state bar and federal bar associations; various law schools and colleges; various business, youth, and church groups.

ATTORNEY JOAQUIN C. ARRIOLA

With almost 60 years of practice as a highly respected lawyer in the Guam and CNMI courts, and as one of Guam's first Chamorro lawyers, Mr. Arriola has been at the forefront of Guam's legal history. In addition to his extensive years of legal practice, Mr. Arriola was a Senator in the fledgling Third and Fourth Guam Legislatures; Legislative Legal Counsel for the Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Guam Legislatures; and Speaker of the Ninth and Tenth Guam Legislatures. He was an Associate Justice (part-time) of the Guam Supreme Court. He served as Chairman on numerous Boards and Commissions, including the then College of Guam Board of Regents, and was legal counsel to many Government of Guam agencies. He has had a varied general practice, with a primary focus in litigation; Mr. Arriola still tries civil cases. He was instrumental in organizing and forming the Bank of Guam, where he has served as general counsel since its incorporation, and has served on the Board of Directors and as Secretary for BankPacific.



Mr. Arriola attended the College of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota from 1947-1950, graduating *cum laude* in 1950. He graduated from the University of Minnesota Law School in 1953 and passed the Minnesota State Bar the same year. He is currently a member of the Guam and CNMI bars, and is admitted to practice before the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and the U.S. Supreme Court. The University of Guam awarded Mr. Arriola its Doctor of Laws (Honoris Causa) in December 2007. Mr. Arriola is the founding partner of Arriola, Cowan & Arriola, Guam's oldest established law office.

PROFESSOR KATHLEEN M. SULLIVAN

Professor Kathleen M. Sullivan, a Partner at Quinn, Emanuel, Urquhart & Sullivan and a Stanley Morrison Professor of Law at Stanford Law School, is a nationally prominent scholar and expert in constitutional law, federal litigation and the U.S. Supreme Court. Author of the nation's leading casebook in constitutional law, she has published articles on federalism, religion, speech, equality, and constitutional theory. A professor of law at Harvard Law School before joining the Stanford Law School faculty in 1993, Ms. Sullivan is also an outstanding litigator who has argued before numerous appeals courts and the U.S. Supreme Court. From 1999 to 2004, Professor Sullivan served as the first woman dean of any school at Stanford.

Freund Award for Teaching Excellence, Harvard, 1992; Recipient, John Bingham Hurlbut Award for Excellence in Teaching, Stanford, 1996; Honoree, The National Law Journal, "The 100 Most Influential Lawyers in America"; Honoree, The Los Angeles and San Francisco Daily Journal, "Top 75 Women Litigators in California"; Honoree, California Lawyer Magazine, "Attorney of the Year," Appellate Litigation; Honoree, The Los Angeles and San Francisco Daily Journal, "Top 100 Lawyers in California," September 29, 2005.

MR. OVIE L. CARROLL

Mr. Ovie L. Carroll is the Director for the Cybercrime Lab at the Department of Justice (DOJ), Computer Crime and Intellectual Property Section (CCIPS) and is an adjunct professor at the George Washington University teaching computer crimes investigation. He has more than 20 years of law enforcement experience. Prior to joining the DOJ, Mr. Carroll was the Special Agent in Charge of the Computer Crimes Unit at the U.S. Postal Service, Office of Inspector General, responsible for all computer intrusion investigations, computer forensic analysis and all deployment, installation and monitoring of technical surveillance equipment in support of criminal investigations. He also served as the Chief, Computer Investigations and Operations Branch, Air Force Office of Special Investigations, Washington Field Office, where he was responsible for coordinating all national level computer intrusions occurring within the U.S. Air Force. He has extensive field experience applying his training to a broad variety of investigations and operations. The Cybercrime lab is responsible for providing computer forensic and other technical support to DOJ attorneys throughout the United States as it applies to implementing the Department's national strategies in combating cyber crimes and intellectual property crimes worldwide.
