BIOGRAPHY OF MR. ALAN DORHOFFER

Mr. Alan Dorhoffer is the Deputy Director of the Office of Education and Sentencing, at the United States Sentencing Commission. He has conducted hundreds of training programs for judges, attorneys, law clerks, and probation officers on federal sentencing issues. Mr. Dorhoffer has also conducted broadcasts on the Federal Judicial Television Network. Mr. Dorhoffer has been the Chair of numerous policy teams, including the Sexual Offense, Firearms, and Criminal History Teams. He has also served on numerous policy development teams, including those studying Booker issues, crack cocaine issues, white collar crime issues, immigration issues, and federal drug sentencing policies. Furthermore, he analyzes U.S. Supreme Court, appellate court, and district court decisions interpreting the federal sentencing guidelines. Mr. Dorhoffer was an Adjunct Professor at the George Mason School of Law. He previously served as a law clerk to the Honorable Edmund A. Sargus in Columbus, Ohio. Mr. Dorhoffer is a graduate of Binghamton University and the George Washington University School of Law.
