ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION OF ANN  
LAWTON FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE  
ELECTRONIC PUBLIC ACCESS FEE  
SCHEDULE ADOPTED BY THE JUDICIAL  
CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED STATES  
COURTS

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request of Michigan State University College of Law Professor Ann Lawton, for an exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts, relating to her research on the Court's Chapter 11 Bankruptcy filings.

The Court finds that Professor Lawton falls within a class of users listed in the Judicial Conference's Electronic Public Access fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption, namely an "individual researcher associated with an educational institution". Accordingly, Professor Lawton shall be exempt for the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court for case files, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of her research. She shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

1. This fee exemption applies only to Ann Lawton, and is valid for only for the purposes stated above;
2. This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system;
3. By accepting this exemption, Ann Lawton agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
4. Ann Lawton is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet based databases;
5. This exemption is valid from March 15, 2013 through April 30, 2014.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
