DISTRICT COURT OF GUAM CONDITION OF READINESS (CCOR) 1 in Response to COVID 19 OUTBREAK

This general order is issued in further response to the outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). On November 27, 2020, the Honorable Lourdes Leon Guerrero, Governor of Guam, issued Executive Order No. 2020-41, declaring that "Guam's recent spike in COVID-19 cases coincides with spikes experienced around the country and the world; and . . . while we have made considerable strides in lowering our [Covid Area Risk] Score, we still have not reached our target number of a CAR Score of 5 . . . ." The most recent executive order further extends the public health emergency for an additional thirty (30) days and is set to expire on December 29, 2020. Our island remains in Pandemic Condition of Readiness I (PCOR I) and subject to some of the most stringent restrictions. Consistent with the Governor of Guam and the findings in Executive Order No. 2020-41, the Court hereby extends the application of General Order Number 20-0032, as amended by General Order Number 20-0039 (allowing for Clerk's Office in-person business by appointment only) and General Order Number 20-0040 (allowing Clerk's Office to accept cash payment). The District Court of Guam remains in Court Condition of Readiness I (CCOR I) through January 5, 2021.
